
Post-Graduate Survey Class of 2020 Highlights

ABOUT THE SURVEY

The Class of 2020 Post-Graduate Survey was conducted by the Southwestern University Center for Career & Professional Development (CCPD). Data collection took place between April prior to May Commencement and continued through the following March, and includes surveys at Commencement, via email prior to and after Commencement, via follow-up phone calls, and from outcomes data published by graduates online. Of the 307 graduates from December 2019, May 2020 and August 2020 who make up this reporting class, the CCPD obtained information on 283 (92 percent of the class).
