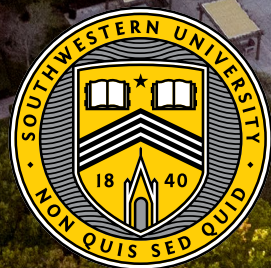

These skills prepare Southwestern graduates to adapt, lead, and make meaningful contributions in a rapidly-changing world.

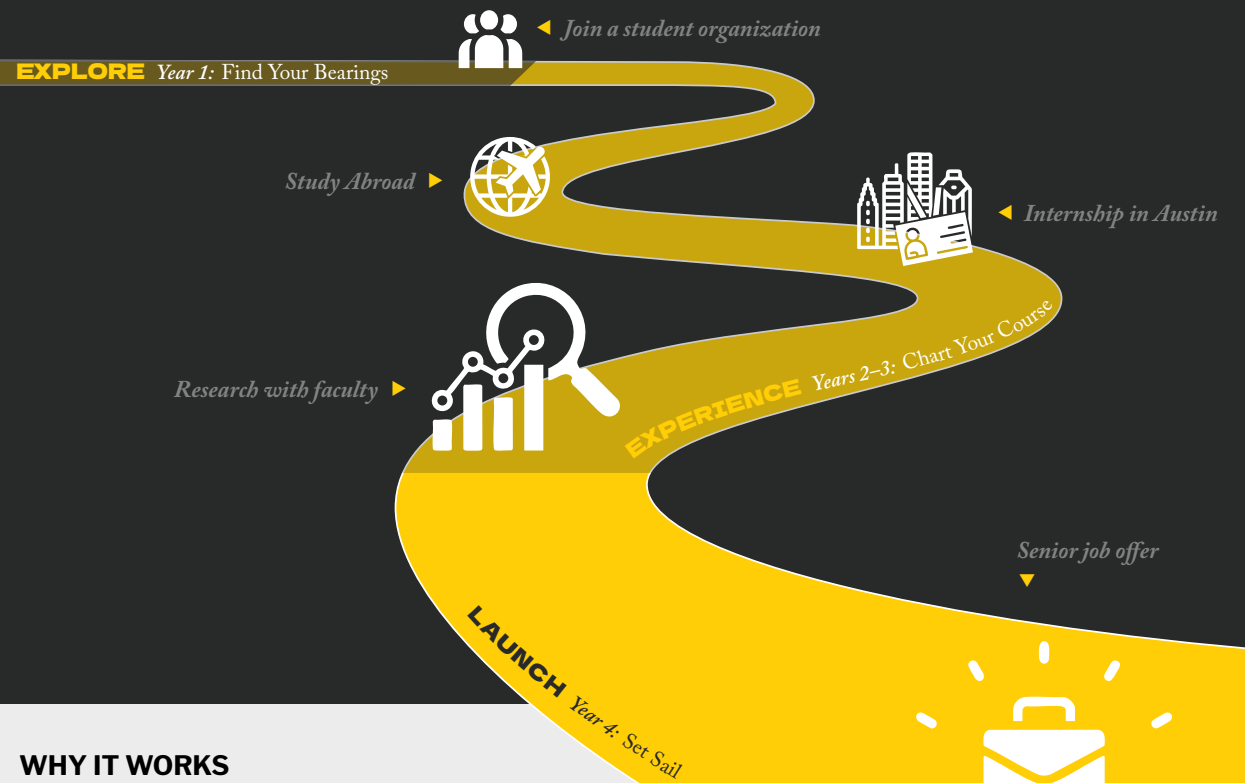

MINORS & CERTIFICATES

Beyond your major, you can specialize with minors (usually 18+ credits) or certificates (focused skill-based credentials).

- **Minors:** Anthropology, Applied Movement and Sport Studies, Art History, Biology, Business, Chemistry, Chinese, Classical Civilization, Classical Languages, Communication Studies, Computer Science, Data Analytics, Design Thinking, Early Modern and Medieval Studies, East Asian Studies, Economics, Education, English, Environmental Studies, Feminist Studies, French, Generic Special Education, German, Health Studies, History, International Studies, Kinesiology, Latin American and Border Studies, Mathematics, Music, Neuroscience, Philosophy, Physics, Political Science, Psychology, Race and Ethnicity Studies, Religion and Culture, Sociology, Spanish, Studio Art, Theatre.
- **Certificates:** Legal Studies, Computer-Aided Design (CAD) & 3D Printing, Spanish for Healthcare Professions.

ACADEMIC ADVISING

Advising at Southwestern is a partnership. You're supported, but you stay in the driver's seat.

- **First Year:** You'll work with a Success Coach, housed in the CCPD, who helps you transition to college, choose courses, and build a strong academic foundation
- **Sophomore–Senior Years:** You'll also have a faculty advisor (typically in your major) who guides your academic path

You have a Success Coach all four years, helping you connect your Pirate Plan and academic experience to your post-graduate goals.

REGISTRATION & PLACEMENT

Getting started includes a few key steps to ensure you're placed in the right courses.

- **Math & Language Placement:** All new students complete assessments to determine the appropriate starting level, so you build on what you know without repeating or jumping too far ahead.
- **Your Schedule:** Once registered, your official schedule is available in Self-Service under the "Course Plan" tab.
- **Pathways To and After Graduation**
 - » The SU curriculum is intentionally designed for students to graduate in eight semesters by taking 16 credits per term.
 - » Some students opt for one of SU's paired post-graduate programs such as the 4+1 programs with Rice University (Accounting) or with Baylor University's Louise Herrington School of Nursing.

ACADEMIC STANDARDS

Understanding Your Credits & Courseload

Southwestern measures coursework in credits rather than traditional “hours.”

- **Typical Schedule:** 4 courses per semester (16 credits)
- **Time Commitment:** ~3 hours of work per credit each week
- **Full-Time Status:** 12+ credits
- **Maximum Load:** 19 credits (approval required above this)
- **To Graduate:** Minimum 127 credits and a cumulative 2.0 GPA

Course Numbering

Course numbering will tell you more about the class you are taking.

Example: PSY33-104

- **PSY33** = Department (Psychology)
 - **10** = Course level* (00–19 = introductory, 20–89 = upper-level)
 - **4** = Credit hours
- * Many courses at the 20-30 level are considered appropriate for new students

Class Standing

Class standing is based on the number of credits you’ve earned:

- **0–29 credits:** First-Year
- **30–59 credits:** Sophomore
- **60–89 credits:** Junior
- **90+ credits:** Senior

Grading System

Southwestern utilizes a plus/minus grading system. Below are the grade point values used to calculate your GPA:

- **A+ / A** = 4.0
- **A-** = 3.67
- **B+** = 3.33
- **B** = 3.0
- **B-** = 2.67
- **C+** = 2.33
- **C** = 2.0
- **C-** = 1.67
- **D+** = 1.33
- **D** = 1.0
- **D-** = 0.67
- **F** = 0.0

FERPA & FAMILY ACCESS

WHO HAS ACCESS TO WHAT?

In college, students control access to their academic and financial information. This is part of a federal law called the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA).

At the postsecondary level, parents cannot access student information unless the student gives permission.



Access is not automatic

Students must grant permission for families to view or discuss their information.

PROXY ACCESS

Allows parents or others to:

- View billing and financial aid
- See grades and GPA (Set up in Self-Service)

3. Click “Select a Proxy” / “Add Person/Relationship”
4. Select Proxy name / Enter the individual’s name and relationship
5. For Student Records Release: Create a PIN and share it with that individual

STUDENT RECORDS RELEASE

Allows parents or others to:

- Speak with University offices
- Discuss FERPA-protected information Requires a PIN for verification

WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?

- The approved individual can contact University offices
- They will be asked for the PIN to verify their identity
- Once verified, staff can discuss student information

HOW TO GRANT ACCESS

Students can give permission by completing Proxy Access/Student Records Release in Self-Service:

1. Log in to Self-Service
2. Select Proxy Access / Student Records Release

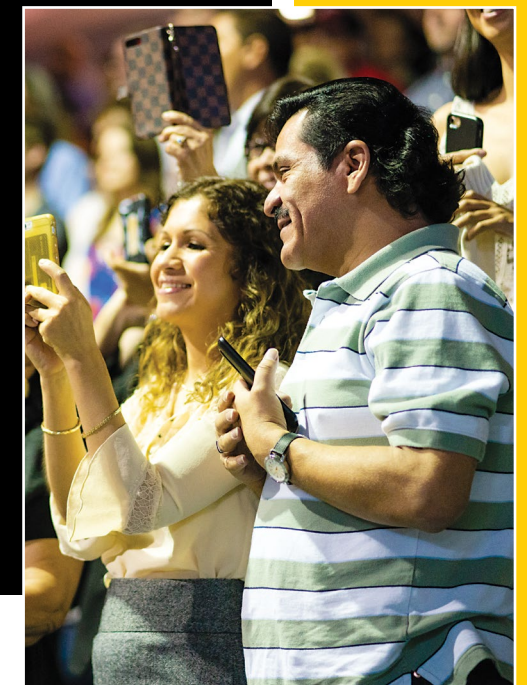
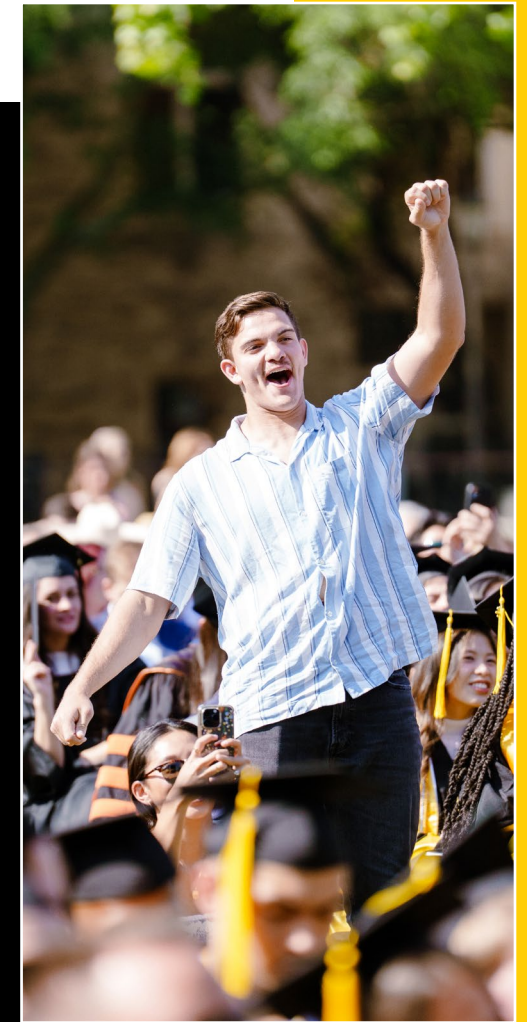

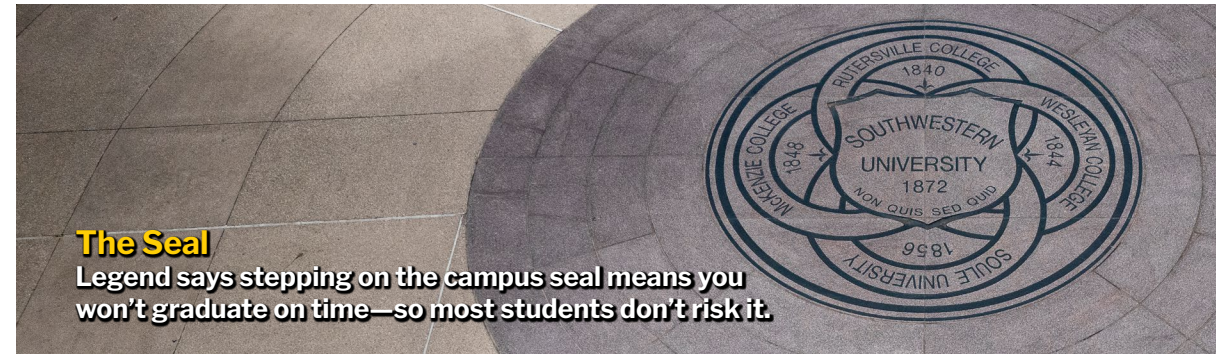
Piratepalooza

Legend says stepping on the campus seal means you won't graduate on time—so most students don't risk it.



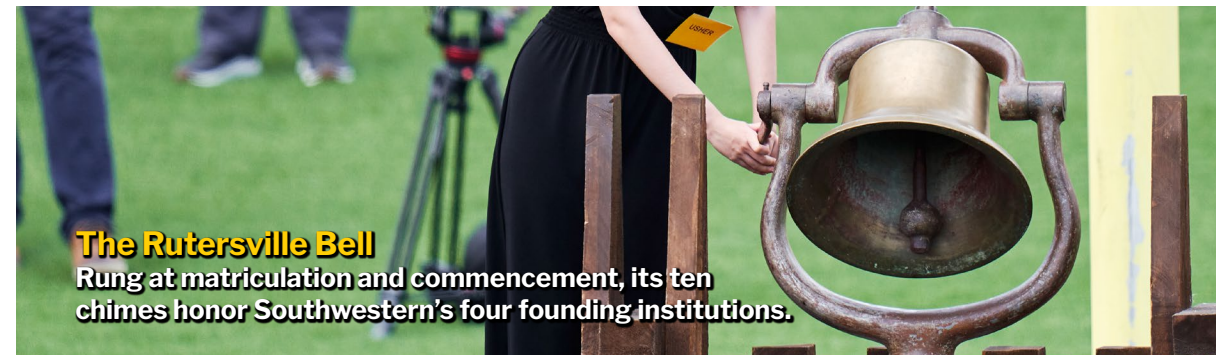
Cullen Tower Signatures
